Considerations for the week

Storms. Sometimes life is fair-sailing and sometimes stormy. Describe a time when someone withstood difficult times by trusting in the hope of Jesus Christ.

Unique hope. How does hope in Christ challenge cultural definitions of success, security, happiness?

An anchor. Consider and comment upon how the characteristics of an anchor are analogous to hope in God. See Hebrews 6:19 and Psalm 42:5. How does hope stabilize us in seasons of suffering?

Waiting. "For in this hope we were saved" (Romans 8:22-25). What does Paul mean? See also Hebrews 11:1.

Power. In practical terms, what does it mean to "overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" (Romans 15:13).

Help. Think back upon a time when words or actions were encouragement for the discouraged – helping another to hope in God. How can we discern ways to help those in need?

Please use these considerations for personal reflection, small group discussions, and with friends and family.
